# What Is A Survey?

"Understanding what we have is the basis of all preservation planning."

The purpose of a survey is to document the evolution of a building, its' location, description, the historic context, and the assessment of the significance and overall heritage.

The results of a survey helps to determine the status of a building or landscape.

There are two types of surveys:



Intensive




Reconnaissance

## INTENSIVE SURVEY

An intensive survey indicates a thorough research of the property.

- Architectural Description of each building on the parcel
- Research of chain of title
- Research of each property owner:
  - Heritage
  - How they used the land
  - What buildings they constructed
  - How they changed it over time
- Photo Documentation:
  - Front façade
  - Foundation
  - Windows & Doors
  - Additions

Determines eligibility for National, State, and Local designation

Louie (Ludwig) Ehlen acquired the property from his parents in 1919 and built the onestory home the same

year.


 Ehlen was recognized for his sugar beets with an award from the head of agriculture in the State.

The property is unique and recognizable to Brighton and Adams County residents, but it is not eligible for the National or State register.

Historic Name: Talbot Ranch

The Talbot Ranch is eligible for a **National** Register **Nomination** 



There are 15 Original Homestead 1909 buildings on this property. The majority were constructed by the Talbot Family between 1890-1910. Utility Shed 1890-1910 Barn 1940s

Bunk House 1909

Suekichi and Toi Morimitsu, purchased the property in 1939 and it is still owned by the Family Trust.

CURRENT USE: Vegetable Farm


The types of buildings on the property indicate many people lived and worked on the farm to deliver vegetables to market.

- The Letterlys purchased from the Rutherfords in 1943
- They added more utility farm buildings to the property
- Grew corn and sold to Bob Sakata


Period Of Significance 1900-1901


Historic Name: Briggs Farmstead


The Briggs Family purchased the land prior to 1899. The house, barn, and outbuildings were constructed in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century.

Brighton was once the center of the dairy industry in the state. The Carlson Family contributed to the growth of Brighton. The Carlson Dairy contributed to the Brighton Creamery, the Sinton Dairy Factory and later the Northern Dairy Factory.

### RECONAISSANCE SURVEY
