

Open Call for Participation:

Adams County Community Health Improvement Coalition

Adams County Health Department (ACHD) is seeking organizational partners interested in participating in a Community Health Improvement Coalition. The Coalition will be responsible for advising the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) process, including developing goals and strategies for identified community health priority areas.

Seeking: Professional partners interested in participating in an active working group facilitated by ACHD staff. Eligible participants include persons working for:

- Non-profit, community-based, or faith-based organizations based in or serving residents of Adams County;
- Healthcare partners (e.g., FQHCs, community-based safety-net clinics, hospital, and other health service and support providers) based in or serving residents of Adams County;
- Educational institutions, including public, private, charter schools and higher education; or
- Other organizations dedicated to improving the health or wellbeing of Adams County residents.

Commitment:

- Monthly, 90-minute meetings, June December 2023 (may require additional meetings or check-ins)
- Additional 1-2 hours per week to complete offline work for the Coalition
- Attendance of and participation in at least 70% of meetings (five of seven)

Agreements. Coalition members must agree to the following:

- Improve community health and wellness
- Advance health equity
- Address the social determinants of health
- Work collaboratively
- Innovate and think creatively: focus "upstream" (i.e., on prevention)
- Put personal and/or business interests second to community interests

Coalition Purpose:

The Adams County Community Health Improvement Coalition will advise and guide the development of the Community Health Improvement Plan, using the 2022 Adams County Community Health Assessment as a starting point, in a process organized by the Colorado Health Assessment and Planning System (CHAPS). The Coalition is a working group of professionals dedicated to improving health for all residents of Adams County. Coalition members will work together collaboratively, supported by ACHD staff, and complete the following deliverables:

- 1. Guide and participate in capacity assessment (CHAPS Phase 4)
- 2. Guide and participate in health issue prioritization (CHAPS Phase 5)
- 3. Guide and participate in information synthesis and decision making
- 4. As part of Priority-Specific Task Forces, develop goals, objectives, and strategies for final two-three priority areas
