



COMMUNITY GROUPS

A group of community members who come together to share ideas, organize, and work together to positively affect the neighborhood. Members can include residents, business owners, and local organizations within a neighborhood. By forming a neighborhood group, neighbors create a unified purpose around a common set of goals. These groups are open to both homeowners and renters who reside in the neighborhoods.





types of **GROUPS**

NEIGHBORHOOD GROUP A voluntary group of neighbors who act as one to preserve and improve their neighborhood. This group may choose to respond to concerns or provide input to county processes that provide benefits and improvement to their neighborhood.

NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION A neighborhood association is formalized by creating the following documents: mission, values, and by-laws. These groups often have a formalized leadership structure within the group and possibly accept dues to support community events.

HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATIONS (HOAs) A non-voluntary group of homeowners who live by a set of bylaws and regulations. HOAs are often initially established by a developer to help maintain the quality of a neighborhood and pay for additional infrastructure improvements. These groups pay a monthly fee and usually meet regularly.

what can COMMUNITY GROUPS DO?



PREVENTION

Work together to report crime, neighborhood safety, and discuss ways to improve the community.

ACCESS & OPPORTUNITY

Learn about county systems, apps, and other technology available to residents and work together to stay informed about county happenings and activities.

CONNECT

Create groups through social media to discuss and participate in neighborhood forums.

ENGAGE

Participate in Town Halls, Public Hearings, and other listening events that the county holds.

ORGANIZE

Write and distribute neighborhood newsletters, flyers, and meet about neighborhood news and events.

ACTIVITIES

Get together by creating bakes sales, runs, cleanups, and a variety of creative events that help everyone meet and greet.

CELEBRATE

Honor the neighborhood's unique characteristics and engage with the county to create a neighborhood plan.

EQUITY

Learn about the distinct cultures that thrive in your community and how to appreciate each in turn.

how to START YOUR GROUP



While there are many types of Community Groups, this checklist provides the most basic structure to help neighborhoods start their own groups. As groups develop, opportunities to create more established and more formal groups, such as a neighborhood association and even a non-profit, are possibilities. However, these formal processes are not necessary to become a recognized neighborhood group. Use the Neighborhood First Meeting Packet to guide your meeting. Utilize this packet to do the following:

- Create a collection of talents within the group. (Who is a social media guru? Who can blog or send out neighborhood letters? Who understands county codes?)
- Create general meet times and structure
- Create a contact list
- Create an idea list of some activities you would like to do

NEIGHBORHOOD COUNCILS AND DISTRICTS

There are five Neighborhood Council Districts in Adams County. There can be any number of neighborhood groups within neighborhood council districts. Neighborhood groups determine who is part of the Neighborhood Council by electing or appointing a representative and alternate from their group to become part of the Neighborhood Council. Each neighborhood council oversees a community fund to allocate funding for neighborhood initiatives.

CRIME PREVENTION

Invite an Adams County Sheriff Neighborhood Deputy to discuss crime prevention. Learn what to report and how to report it. Work together with neighbors to utilize technology to keep your neighborhood crime free!

EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS

Invite local experts to talk about how to make an emergency preparedness plan for you, your family, and your community. Obtain information and resources concerning disaster preparation, response, and recovery to include FEMA assistance grants and programs designed to aid victims of disaster events.

FIRE SAFETY

Invite an outreach staff member from your local fire district to come talk about fire prevention. Learn how to keep your family safe and how to plan for a fire emergency.

FINANCIAL WORKSHOPS

Who wouldn't mind some extra cash in the bank? Learn about some savvy ways to boost your savings accounts. Invite a financial advisor to come talk to your group.

GOING GREEN

Do you have a neighbor with an amazing garden, another who is a composter, someone with an amazing yard or lawn? Bring your experts together for a neighborhood forum on ways to be green. Challenge each other to adopt new ways of being green.

GARDEN WORKSHOP

Invite the <u>Adams County Master Gardeners</u> to come talk to your neighborhood about gardens. Learn about what grows best in your area, when to plant, and more!

IDENTITY SECURITY

Invite local experts to come talk about how to ensure your personal information stays safe in this digital age.

CODE COMPLIANCE

Have questions about storing vehicles, adding structures, or mitigating weeds? Invite a Code Compliance expert to talk to your neighborhood about local standards and regulations.

INTERNET SAFETY FOR KIDS

Invite an expert to teach parents/guardians/grandparents about how to keep kids and teens safe while utilizing technology. Learn about the latest apps, technology, and more to make sure your children and teens are safe.

SUSTAINABLE LIVING

Learn how to live more sustainably. Invite local experts who can help homeowners create energy and water audits as well as provide more ideas to cut costs on utility bills and help the planet!

TAX WORKSHOP




HISTORY WALK Invite local historians to help make a guided tour of your neighborhood. Record it and put it on Facebook.

ADAMS COUNTY GOVERNMENT CENTER

4430 S. ADAMS COUNTY PKWY., BRIGHTON

"Echoes of the Range" by award-winning artist, Douwe Blumberg, is an interior/exterior sculpture at the Adams County Government Center in Brighton. This stainless-steel work explores negative space and its connection to emotion and comfort. If you go, be sure to wander around the first floor to explore a variety of other installations by local Colorado artists. Judith Dickinson's "We, the People of Adams County" is made up of two large oil paintings full of real county residents!

ROTELLA PARK

1824 CORONADO PKWY. N., DENVER

Rotella Park in Welby is home to three kinetic sculptures by Colorado artist, John King. "Sky Writing," "Cloud Castle," and the "Sun, Moon and Stars Windvane" honor where the sky meets the grass and the wide open, natural field. Fun fact: One of these is interactive and you can spin it with your own kinetic force!





THE STANLEY MARKETPLACE

2501 N. DALLAS ST., AURORA

Adams County is the proud home of The Stanley Marketplace in Aurora, a collection of local businesses, artisans, and funky venues. This is a great place to wander around, have a snack, and explore the history of Stanley Aviation, where test planes took off and landed on the runway.

AAR RIVER GALLERY

3707 W. 73RD AVE., WESTMINSTER

Westminster is home to many art and culture gems. Highlights include the Westminster Historic Art District with the Aar River Gallery, loaded with local artisan goods; the Westminster Historical Society; and the annual Latino Festival. <u>Go find all the public art in</u> <u>Westminster with this map.</u>

RIVERDALE REGIONAL PARK

9755 HENDERSON RD., BRIGHTON

Riverdale Regional Park is the crown jewel of Adams County, with lakes, trails, open parks, and a rambling creek running through it. Come here to fish, play disc golf or the original, have a picnic, ride bikes, or watch the July 3rd annual fireworks show. Keep your eyes open for art on the trails, concerts, and visit our veterans memorial.

THE MAGNOLIA STREET ART CENTER

6600 E. 74TH AVE., COMMERCE CITY

The Magnolia Street Art Center in Derby is a co-working space for local artists, with about a dozen spaces hosting artists working in a variety of media. This innovative space is an inspiring nod to the homegrown arts in Adams County!





THE BRIGHTON ARMORY

300 STRONG ST., BRIGHTON

The Brighton Armory is a local treasure right here in our county seat. What was once headquarters for Company K, the 157th Infantry of the Colorado National Guard, is now a restored landmark that hosts concerts, theater, and visual art shows. The sound is incredible, the talent top notch, and the vibes are so great!

HISTORIC BROMLEY FARM

1594 E. BROMLEY LN., BRIGHTON

Adams County pride is in its farms, but have you heard about an innovative look at agriculture, called art & ag? With a focus on local food and artisan goods, Historic Bromley Farm hosts soap-making and herb-infused oils classes, along with field-to-table cooking classes and other events throughout the year!

PECOS JUNCTION STATION - 62ND and N. WASHINGTON, DENVER CLEAR CREEK/FEDERAL STATION - 5800 FEDERAL BLVD., DENVER WESTMINSTER STATION - 6995 GROVE ST., WESTMINSTER

RTD lightrail stations are always great places to spot artwork. Adams County is home to the Bimmer Torres mural at Pecos Junction Station, the collaborative piece by Bimmer Torres and Addison Carl at Clear Creek/Federal Station, and a Pat Milbury at the Westminster Station.

COMMERCE CITY

4540 GRAPE ST., DENVER

Head to Commerce City to check out the mural by Thomas Evans, aka Detour. This piece is a testament to our artist community and adds beauty to a traffic corridor through the city.





THE BISON RIDGE RECREATION CENTER 13905 E. 112TH AVE., COMMERCE CITY

The Bison Ridge Recreation Center in Commerce City is home to several pieces of public art — giant grazing metal buffalos and massive inspiring roundabout sculptures to name a couple.

CLEAR CREEK TRAIL

NEAR PECOS and 64TH

The Clear Creek trail near Pecos and 64th is home to an art installation made of tiles created by students from the Guardian Angels School.
