

# COUNTY AIMS AND BACKGROUND



- Front Range Waste Diversion (FRWD) grant for Waste Diversion Improvement Project
- Sustainable Adams County 2030 Plan
  - Supports Goal 5, Community Waste
- Waste diversion rate for unincorporated Adams County is unknown
- CDPHE goals for Front Range waste diversion:
  - 39% by 2026
  - 51% by 2036

# PROJECT AIMS

#### Adopt a hauler licensing ordinance that:

- Maintains open market for waste haulers
- Creates level playing field for all haulers
- Ensures community health and safety
- Collects waste data and tracks diversion progress
- Provides equitable and expanded access to recycling
- Increases diversion and waste reduction


# SOME THINGS WE HEARD FROM HAULERS IN MAY:

- Haulers are subject to ordinances elsewhere; Adams County should try to reduce redundancy.
- Determining jurisdictional boundaries (incorporated vs. unincorporated Adams County) is a challenge.
- Stickers and/or decals are not preferred.
- Data reporting can be time-consuming.
- Truck inspections are redundant and time-consuming.
- Hauling recyclables (especially for eastern portions of the county) is expensive.



# **METHODOLOGY**

- Survey postcards were mailed to randomly selected residential addresses in unincorporated Adams County
- Statistically valid survey
  - 90% confidence level
  - Margin of error +/- 7%
- English and Spanish survey option
- Out of all complete responses:
  - Residency: 47% have lived in Adams County 15+ years
  - Home Ownership: 93% own their homes, 7% rent
  - Home Structure: 88% live in single-family homes, 5% in mobile homes
  - Gender Identity: 54% of respondents identify as women
  - Age: 24% of responses are 65+, 23% were 35-44





# METHODOLOGY (CONTINUED)



- Survey included questions related to:
  - Demographic information
  - Trash/Recycle/Compost services provided to household
  - Access to services
  - Opinions/beliefs about recycling
  - Barriers
  - Willingness to pay for services

# RESULTS

- When asked if residents have convenient access to recycling, more respondents disagreed than agreed.
- Most survey respondents (87%) report that they believe recycling helps conserve natural resources and the environment.
- Most respondents (80%) support increasing access to recycling in unincorporated Adams County.
- Nearly 50% of respondents indicated not having recycling collection service at their homes.
  - East of DEN, only 25% of respondents reported having recycling service.

# RESULTS (CONTINUED)

- Largest barriers to recycling reported by survey respondents:
  - Knowledge, knowing what to recycle
  - Cost
  - Uncertainty, citing that recycling guidelines often change
- Largest barriers to recycling reported by survey respondents east of DEN:
  - Knowledge, knowing what to recycle
  - Uncertainty, citing that recycling guidelines often change
  - Trash service providers don't offer recycling

# RESULTS (CONTINUED)

- When asked if the respondent's trash service provider offers recycling collection service:
  - 27% of respondents were unsure
  - 54% of respondents east of DEN were unsure

# IN SUMMARY:

- ✓Only ~50% of households report having recycling service.
- ✓ Many respondents (25%+) are unsure if recycling services are offered.
- ✓ Respondents are supportive of recycling and are in favor of expanded access.





# WHAT HAULERS ARE INCLUDED?

#### Residential (SF + MF), Commercial, Institutional generator sectors:

- MSW (including recycle-only and compost-only haulers)
- Roll-offs (all sectors, to include MSW and C+D)
- Junk Removal

#### Does NOT apply to:

- Scrap metal haulers
- Landscapers
- Small contractors

# BASICS: SAFETY AND LABELING

By implementing a hauler licensing ordinance, Adams County intends to maintain an open market subscription system for waste haulers and ensure a level playing field for all haulers.

#### **ELEMENTS**

- ✓ Require annual waste hauler license (consolidated application)
- ✓ Require haulers to be properly insured
   ✓ Require measures to reduce leakage and spillage
- ✓ Require vehicles and roll-off containers to be labeled with business name and phone number
- ✓ Require copy of license to be kept within each covered vehicle ✓ Include penalties for non-compliance
- ✓ Include annual licensing fee to cover administrative cost of licensing
- X Require vehicle inspection
- X Require vehicle decals or stickers


# TONNAGE DATA REPORTING

Adams County intends to collect tonnage data from haulers to measure diversion and track progress.

#### **ELEMENTS**

- ✓ Require tonnage reporting using County-supported Re-TRAC tool.
- ✓ Require name of facilities utilized for each waste stream.
- ✓ Require receipt retention for at least two years.
- ✓ Make records available for quality assurance audits by county staff.\*

\*All information that is considered confidential pursuant to provisions of the Colorado Open Records Act shall be treated as such.

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

# INCREASE ACCESS TO RECYCLING

Adams County would like for the hauler licensing ordinance to increase equitable access to recycling.

#### **ELEMENTS**

- ✓ Require MSW haulers to <u>offer</u> recycling service to all single-family, multi-family and commercial customers that receive trash collection service.
- ✓ Require haulers to inform existing trash customers of recycling service offering at least once per year (must be shared directly with customer).
- ✓ Require haulers to inform new trash customers of recycling service offering at time of initial service request/agreement.
- √ Require all recycling services offered by MSW haulers to meet 'minimum recyclables list.'
- ✓ Require guarantee that all materials collected as recyclables are delivered to a recycling facility (to include contamination threshold).

# ADDITIONAL DIVERSION

Adams County is interested in finding ways to support increased diversion to achieve the county's sustainability goals.

#### **ELEMENTS**

- ✓ Require waste haulers to provide recycling guidelines to all subscribed customers annually and upon initial sign-up for recycling services.
- ✓ Include 'minimum' recycling list.
- ✓ Require assurance of materials collected as recyclables are delivered to recycling processor.
- X Require recycling service costs to be embedded in trash collection fees.
- X Require volume-based pricing (pay-as-you-throw).

# LICENSING APPLICATION

- Annual license renewal process:
  - ✓ Require basic company contact information (address, phone, etc.),
    materials collected, and basic collection methods
  - ✓ Collect vehicle information (make, model, VIN, date of last DOT inspection, etc.)
  - ✓ Attest to meeting insurance policy requirements and vehicle maintenance requirements
  - ✓ Utilizes same online platform for both license application submittal and waste tonnage reporting
