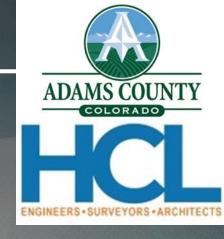

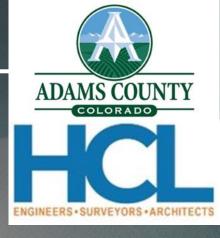

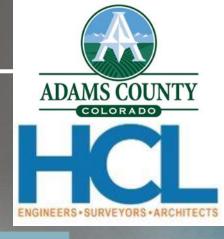

PROJECT IMPACTS

Understanding the Right of Way Process



Right of Way

Fee Simple (Proposed right-of-way):

- Acquisition of all rights and interests (you're selling your rights to the parcel in question).
- The County will purchase a parcel of land on your property, which will be owned by the County.

Permanent Easement

Permanent use of property for a specific project use. For example, drainage maintenance, power lines, underground utilities, etc.

Property owner retains ownership of the parcel with restrictions on future use.

Temporary Easement

Temporary use or rental of property for a specific project use.

This type of easement expires after a certain period of time and property owner retains ownership of the parcel.

THE RIGHT OF WAY PROCESS



The right of way process is outlined below:





Adams County will make offer of Compensation based on valuation



Real Estate specialists (agents) are currently contacting those individuals with property impacts within the project area, requesting permission to enter to complete our survey. This survey work is an important step in determining a fair market valuation.

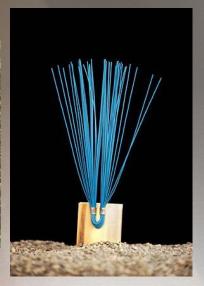
Agent contacts property owner and coordinates staking of necessary parcels

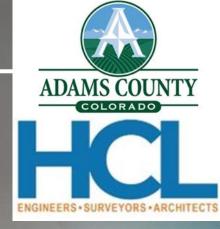
Temporary staking of Acquisitions and Temporary Construction Easements (TCE) will be performed on request to assist the property owner and appraiser in determining impacts to the property.

THE RIGHT OF WAY PROCESS

The staking will be done using hubs or whiskers with colored flags. Typically, blue flags represent the proposed ROW acquisition, and pink flags represent a TCE.
