Attendance Matters







Students who attend more regularly in K-1 are more likely to be reading on grade level by 3rd grade

Students who are chronically absent in middle school are more likely to disengage and dropout of high school

Students with high attendance in 9th grade (above 90%) are more likely to stay in school and graduate with their peers.



Chronic absenteeism

Students who miss more than 10% of school

2 days per month can add up to missing 10% of school

Lay out clothing and pack lunches the night before.


Got a late riser?









Colorado and Adams County attendance is improving from pandemic high rates of chronic absenteeism




Students do not experience attendance consistently

Some students need specific supports








How can we organize to support attendance




Organizing collective responses
