VI. General SCFD Updates – Dana Manyothane

- a. SCFD Board Meetings Last Meeting: Thursday, November 21 at 1:00 pm. The board voted to approve the slate of officers for 2025: Chairperson, Jacki Cooper Melmed; Vice-Chair, Councilperson Jamie Torres; Secretary, Dan Brown; Treasurer, Suzanne Crawford. Thurs. January 16, 2025, in-person Board planning session. Next Meeting; Thurs. February 27, 2025, regular board meeting.
- b. SCFD Revenue Report: The October 2024 SCFD sales and use tax revenue was \$7,411,456.83. The November 2024 SCFD sales and use tax revenue was \$6,947,744.35. The 2024 year-to-date (YTD) sales and use tax revenue is \$ \$78,001,187.63. This compares to the YTD 2023 sales and use tax revenue of \$78,344,500.10. The variance is (\$343,312.47), a 0.44% decrease in YTD 2024 over YTD 2023.
- c. Staffing Update: SCFD Director, Deborah Jordy, announced she will transition to a senior advisor role in June 2025. The SCFD board will begin the search for a new executive director in the coming months.
